However, with the encouragement and help of his wife, Diana, Robin was able to leave the hospital and spend the rest of his life advocating for people with disabilities and popularizing a new wheelchair with a built-

in respirator.

Rotary is working with the film's producer, Robin and Diana's son, Jonathan Cavendish, to promote the organization's work to eradicate polio.

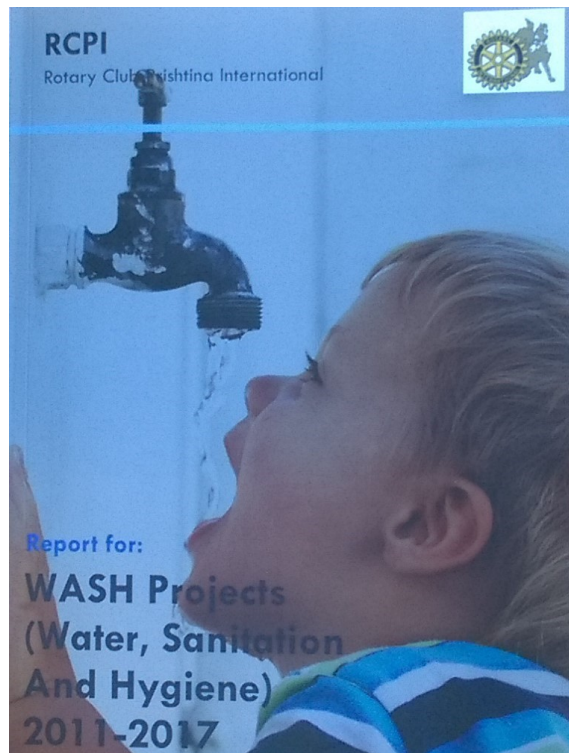
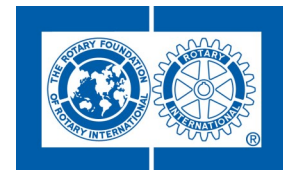
They had a dinner for all participants.

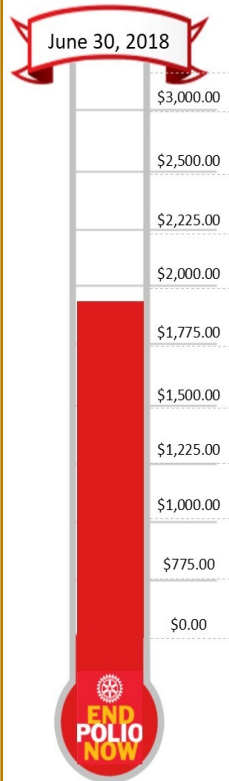

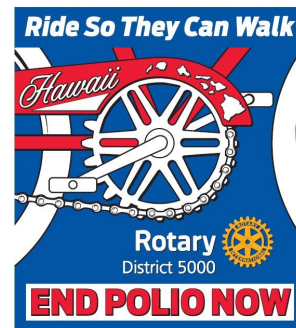
